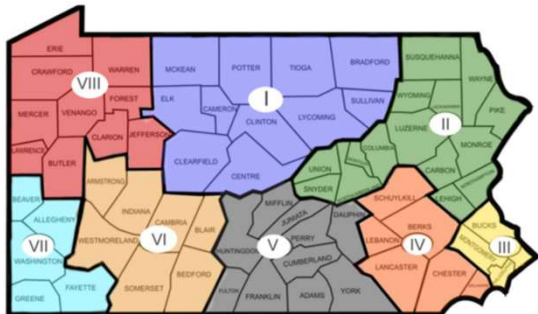

2022-2023 Chapter Challenge

The School Nutrition Association of PA's Chapter Challenges are designed to strengthening our organization as a whole. By completing the chapter challenges, the chapters help us meet the needs of our members through professional development and advocacy.

Challenge 1 – Voice of Child Nutrition

1. Submit a photo and summary of a chapter meeting for use on SNAPA social media and newsletters. Send to executivedirector@snapa.org
2. Share PA Free Meals Task Force information at a meeting. Sends a letter encouraging additional State support for school meals to a local paper.

Challenge 2 – Career Growth

1. Share SNA and SNAPA scholarship and awards opportunities at a Chapter meeting. Nominate at least one member for a scholarship or award.

Challenge 3 - Stakeholder Community

1. Invite a SNAPA Industry Sponsor to collaborate on a Chapter event – as a speaker, to show a product, or to provide a meal.
2. Share an article or resource from an allied organization with members. Learn more at schoolnutrition.org/back-to-school/allied-partner-resources/

Challenge 4 – Thriving Community

1. Pre-plan 3 chapter meeting dates at the beginning of the school year. Provide your Regional Rep with the dates and locations of each meeting no later than September 30, 2022. Host one virtual meeting to earn a \$50 bonus award.
2. Submit the list of your chapter's officials to your Regional Rep by September 30, 2022. Additionally, submit your 22-23 yearly financial information to your Regional Rep by June 16, 2023.
