THE COST OF DISTRIBUTING SCHOOL MEALS

Researchers at the University of Washington School of Public Health and the Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health are working on a study to understand the total cost of delivering school meals during the pandemic. The hope is study results will inform policy and program response for both future emergencies and long-term antihunger efforts and help demonstrate the value of school meals to go during times when schools are not in session (e.g., summer).

The survey takes about 15-20 minutes, and upon completion respondents can enter a raffle for one of three \$100 cash cards.
